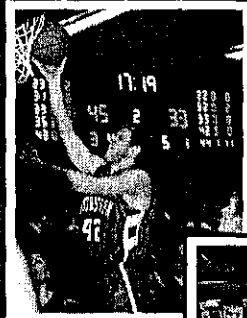

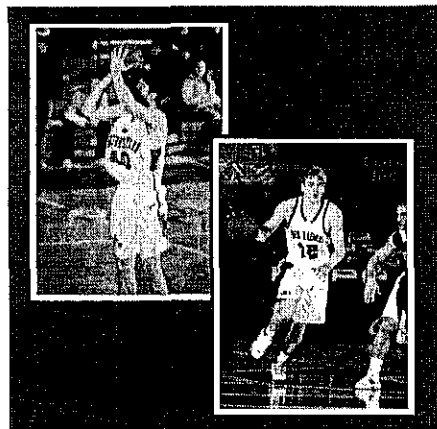

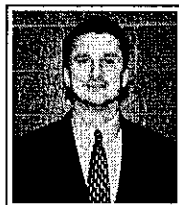

CAMP DIRECTOR



Kris Korver-Men's Basketball Head Coach

In his eight years at the helm of the Red Raider men's basketball program, Coach Korver has led his team to the national tournament each season. He has compiled an impressive 222-48 (.822) overall record, 115-23 (.833) in the GPAC. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program, having won his 200th game last season. He led his team to the GPAC post season championship in 2008, qualified for the national tournament, earned their second straight Final Four berth, and finished with a 30-5 record. Coach Korver led his team to the national title in 2001 and 2003 and also reached the Final Four in 2002 and 2007. In 2005, Coach Korver's squad made it to the Elite Eight. Coach Korver earned NAIA Coach of the Year honors in 2003.

During his tenure, Coach Korver's teams have either shared or won the GPAC regular season title six times, most recently in 2007. Korver has been named the GPAC Coach of the Year three times.

Prior to his coaching duties at Northwestern, Korver was a teacher and coach in California, leading his team to the playoffs three out of four years. An alum of Northwestern ('92) and a former Raider basketball player, Korver ranks second with a 91.4 individual free throw percentage and is 11th on the list for three-point field goal percentage in a season at 46.1%.

Korver and his wife, Ann, have three children: Christian, Elizabeth and Luke. Aside from his basketball duties, Korver is an instructor in the kinesiology department.

FACILITIES

All camps will be held in Northwestern's spacious Bullman Center for Health, Physical Education and Intercollegiate Athletics. Campers also will use the facilities of the adjacent Rowenhorst Student Center. The student center provides area for many leisure opportunities including a big screen TV and game room.

EXCELLENT COACHING AND INSTRUCTION

Excellent coaches will be present at each of the camps to give the best possible instruction in the fundamentals of basketball. Individual attention will also be given to each camper.

In addition, Northwestern College players will assist the coaches throughout the week.

Outstanding lectures will be provided by the coaching staff and by guest lecturers.
