Earl Woudstra - Head Coach

Coach Earl Woudstra is currently in his 15th year as the head coach of the Northwestern College women's basketball team. Woudstra's teams have won GPAC championships in 2000, 2001, and 2007. The Red Raider women have won two NAIA Division II national championships, in 2001 and 2008. The 2008 team finished with a 35-2 record. The Raiders have competed in 7 national tournaments, in addition to the National Championships, they finished as national runner-up in 2000, in the Final Four in 2006, the Elite Eight in 2002 and the Sweet Sixteen in 1999.

Coach Woudstra has been named the NAIA national coach of the year in 2001 and 2008. He has been privileged to coach 10 NAIA All-Americans and 20 Scholar-Athletes.

For Woudstra, playing basketball at Northwestern is about more than wins and losses. Academic excellence and character issues are important to the coaching staff. "A team that wants to play for an audience of One and for each other will achieve success," Woudstra said.

In addition to his coaching duties, Woudstra is a Professor of Kinesiology and Assistant Athletic Director. He and his wife, Karen, have four children: Brandon and his wife, Kyndara and their daughter Jaelye, Jaime, Brady and Jenna.

Chris Yaw - Assistant Head Coach



Coach Chris Yaw is completing his 5th season as the head assistant to the Northwestern women's basketball team. Coach Yaw has been instrumental in the development of individual players in addition to coordinating the Red Raider defense.

Coach Yaw teaches middle school math at MOC/FV, where he also serves as an assistant football coach.

FUNDAMENTAL CAMPS

For players in grades 6 through 10. Participants will receive quality instruction in all areas of basketball fundamentals. With the focus on fundamentals, particular emphasis will be made in the areas of shooting and individual offensive skills. Participants will play on a team that plays 7 regulation games and will also participate in fast break and fourth quarter tournaments. Individual and group contests are also highlights of the camp.

Participants may choose a day camp, includes 3 noon meals and only 4 regulation games, a commuter status with full camp participation and noon and evening meals with no overnight lodging, or the resident camp which includes overnight lodging in an air conditioned dorm room along with all breakfast, noon, and evening meals.

Camps will begin on Monday, July 6 and July 27, and conclude on Thursday afternoon, July 9 and July 30.

Both camps are open to girls that will enter grades 6 through 10 during the 2009-10 school year.

CAMP ORGANIZATION

- Participants in the July 6-9 camps will be divided into groups and teams with students from other schools.
- Participants in the July 27-30 camps will be placed on teams with students from their own school, or placed on blended teams if they attend as an individual.
- Coaches for both camps will primarily be high school and middle school coaches from area schools in addition to members of the Northwestern College coaching staff and team.
- Camps will begin at 1:00 Monday afternoon and conclude at 1:00 on Thursday afternoon. Meals begin on Monday evening.
